## AD-HOC FLAGSHIP COMMITTEE



The Ad-Hoc Committee convened in a solemn atmosphere, shadowed by the weight of uncertainty and past betrayals. Representatives from Serbia, Montenegro, Bulgaria, Greece, and Romania gathered not in pursuit of conquest, but to confront a growing storm. Voices, though calm, carried the gravity of history—echoing fears of lost identity, external manipulation, and the erosion of national dignity. One after another, ministers rejected silence and submission, replacing them with calls for solidarity and measured resolve. The message was clear: unity is no longer a choice but a necessity.

Discussions emphasized that this was not about drawing new lines on a map, but about ensuring the ones already drawn held meaning—secured by trust, and respected by all. Each delegate underscored a commitment to defense, not aggression; to peace, not passivity. Respect, they agreed, must be mutual or not at all.

The committee did not end in fanfare but in a collective stillness—one that spoke of readiness, of alliances forged not in ambition but in understanding. This gathering marked a quiet turning point: not the beginning of war, but the firm declaration that peace, to endure, must be defended with unity, purpose, and the will to act when diplomacy alone is no longer enough.



The United Nations Human Rights Council notes systemic abuses in the Darién Gap, where migrants face violence, exploitation, and non-refoulement violations. Venezuelans, fleeing arbitrary detention and economic collapse driven by hyperinflation, endure perilous crossings. Urgent regional cooperation is needed to uphold human rights, ensure safe passage, and address root causes of forced displacement.

The agenda for this year's UNSC committee states Contemplating the efficacy of UN operations in the Sahel region in addressing coups d'état, with special emphasis on reforming the United Nations Integrated Strategy for the Sahel. The goal for this agenda is to make the UN's strategy more effective in preventing military takeovers and supporting more stable governments. The delegate of France further makes its stance by questioning the committee's overlooking the fact that Niger is in 142.2 billion dollar debt from USA. In fact, almost 7 countries in Africa and 7 in the Sahel are in debt of the western countries but have not asked for it.

Lok Sabha saw a fiery session as it commenced discussions on the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2024, with sparks flying when Prime Minister Narendra Modi initiated the floor with a controversial remark questioning "what all Muslims have taken from the country." The opposition immediately turned against him for his remarks, and the tone for the rest of the debate was set by the combative tone. All in all, the bill's fate hangs in the balance. What is certain, though, is that the Lok Sabha has been thrown into a bitter fight between "constitutional principles and political narratives"—a conflict that could determine the shape of religious freedom and administrative power for years to come.
