The initiative provides a dynamic platform where students can simulate parliamentary debates, understand legislative processes, and develop a solutions-driven mindset.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's call to empower **one lakh** youth without political lineage to actively participate in governance is a driving force behind YiP. He emphasizes that:

“The strength of democracy lies not in lineage but in the merit and ideas of those who dare to lead.”

YiP aligns with this vision by:

- **Bridging the Gap:** Moving beyond theoretical education to offer a hands-on governance experience.
- **Leadership Development:** Encouraging public speaking, decision-making, and negotiation skills.
- **Policy Awareness:** Engaging youth in meaningful policy discussions.
- **Creating Changemakers:** Preparing young Indians to take an active role in shaping the nation's future.



Program Structure



YiP follows a Three-Tier engagement model:

CITY ROUND

- Schools nominate students.
- Initial debates and policy discussions at the local level.
- Winners proceed to the regional rounds.



REGIONAL ROUND

- Hosted in **8 cities** across India.
- Topics to be discussed likewise:
 - Youth Affairs
 - Technology & Cyber Security
 - Environment Protection and sustainability
 - Education Policy System
 - Women Empowerment & Child Safety
- The Top 15-20 from each Regional Round proceed to National



NATIONAL ROUND

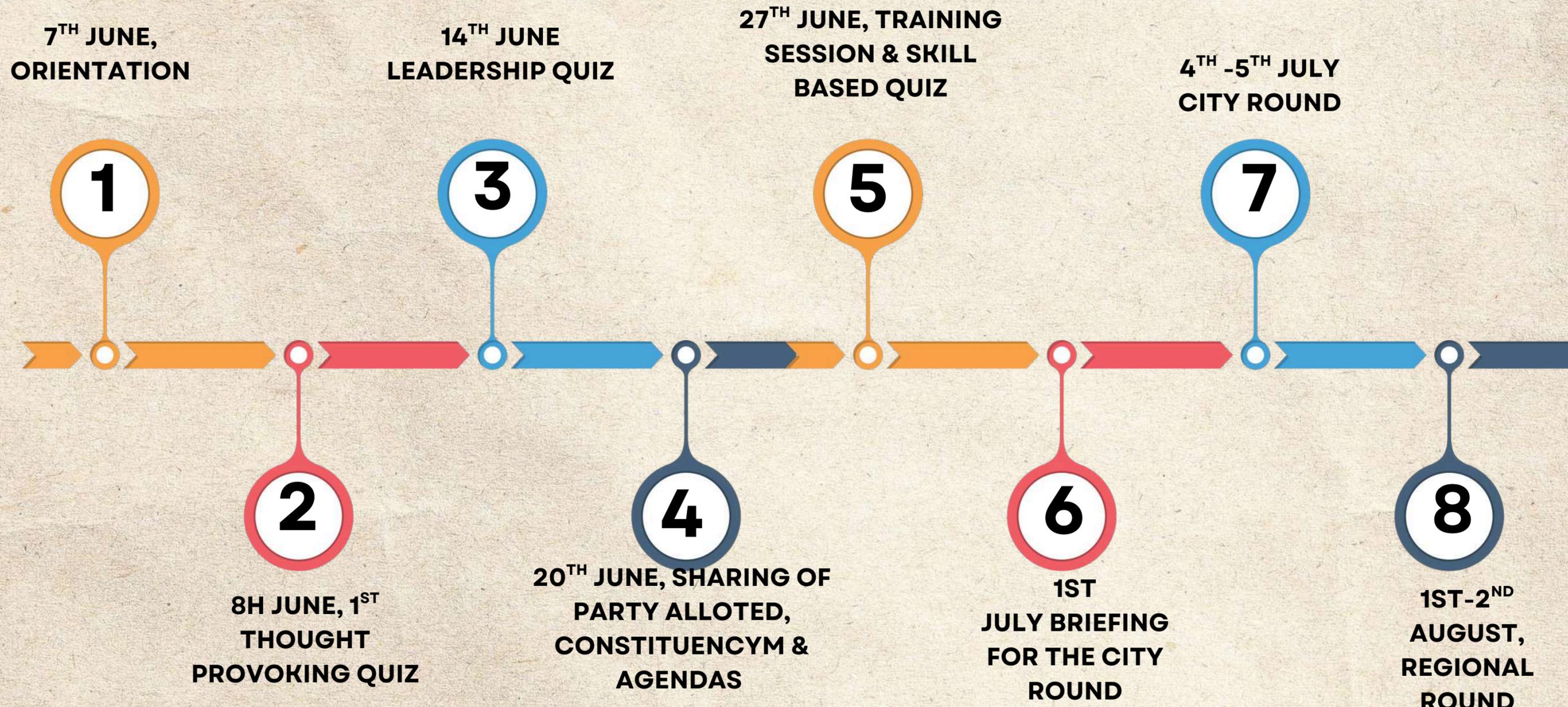
- National Finals to begin from the Prep Round to be held virtually (one week prior to the National Finals)

Whats in it
FOR YOU?

Here's how YOU will be engaged:

1. WhatsApp Video Submission (Topic-based)

Students will share a short video on a pre-shared topic.

Skills Enhanced: Communication, clarity of thought, digital presentation, confidence.

2. Participation in 2 WhatsApp Quizzes

Interactive quizzes with exciting rewards for winners.

Skills Enhanced: General awareness, quick thinking, competitiveness, attention to detail.

3. Brainstorming & Research on Central Agenda

Students will prepare a speech on the event's main theme.

Skills Enhanced: Research, content writing, public speaking, critical thinking.

4. Expression During Question Hour

Opportunity to share views or ask questions during the event.

Skills Enhanced: Articulation, active listening, spontaneous thinking, self-expression.

5. Open House Debate – Ruling vs. Opposition

An engaging debate where students will represent sides and present their arguments.

Skills Enhanced: Logical reasoning, public speaking, teamwork, confidence in expressing dissent or support.

6. Committee Agenda Discussion & Bill Drafting

Each student will join a committee, discuss real-world issues, and contribute to drafting a bill.

Skills Enhanced: Collaboration, problem-solving, policy thinking, drafting and negotiation.

7. Voting Rights in the House

Students will vote to pass or reject proposed bills.

Skills Enhanced: Decision-making, critical analysis, understanding of democratic processes.

8. Social Media Showcasing

Participants can showcase their speeches, performances, and involvement by tagging [@young.indians](#) and [@youngindianskanpur](#).

Skills Enhanced: Personal branding, confidence, digital engagement, community connection.



HOW?

Pre-Event Activities

- **Formation of Parties:** Students divided into 5 parties (Team A–E).
- **Allocation of Constituencies:** Each student is assigned a constituency.
- **Research Briefing:** Guided research on topics (post-agenda release).
- **Question Hour Preparation:** Each student submits 1 high-quality question.
(through a google form)

Central Agenda

- The key topics and central agenda will be disclosed on 20th June 2025.
- This will give students ample time to research, prepare speeches, and form viewpoints before the event.
- 90 second speech to prepare



Day 1 – Opening of the Day

Registration: 8am

Chief Guest arrival: 8:30 am

- Opening Ceremony & National Anthem
- Introduction of Dignitaries
- Rules & Code of Conduct by Event Chairman

Formation of the House

- **Submission of Party Symbols & Manifestos**

Each team submits:

Party name

Hand-drawn symbol (original)

3–4-point party manifesto reflecting their stand

- **Selection of Party Leaders**

Each team selects a leader. If there's no consensus, interested members give short speeches and the team votes.

Formation of the House

- **Introduction of Party Leaders**

Each leader explains their party's vision, symbol, and goals (1-minute speech).

- **Speaker Candidate Speeches & Voting**

Candidates for Speaker and Deputy Speaker give short speeches. All MPs (students) vote to elect them.

- **Oath-Taking Ceremony**

All students take a formal oath, symbolizing their role as Members of Parliament.

Formation of the House

- **Coalition Formation & PM Selection**

Party leaders meet to:

Form ruling alliances

Elect the Prime Minister

Appoint Leader of Opposition (if consensus fails, selection is speech-based)

- **Cabinet Formation**

The ruling alliance selects:

Cabinet Ministers (major ministries will be announced)

Sub-cabinet Ministers (Ministers of State)

A diverse and inclusive cabinet is encouraged.

Formation of the House

- **Introduction of Ministers & Shadow Ministers**

PM introduces cabinet with their portfolios

Opposition leader introduces shadow ministers to counter them

Public Speeches & Policy Briefing

- **Opening Speeches on Matters of Urgent Public Importance**

Selected students give 90-second speeches on national issues relevant to the yet-to-be-announced agenda.

- **Briefing on Policy-Making & Bill Drafting**

Speaker or mentor explains how a bill becomes a law, and how students will work in committees to draft policy.

- **Formation of Committees**

Each party forms a bill drafting committee with

1 main drafter

1–2 presenters

Supporting researchers

Overnight Task

- Committees understand the problem and draft a bill
- Submit by 8:00 AM to speaker next morning for review
- Drafts shared in common group

Day 2 – Opening of the Day

- House Resumes with National Anthem
- Address by Event Chairman – Recap & Guidelines
- Question Hour
- Parliamentary Debate (based on disclosed agenda)
- Zero Hour Discussions

House in Session

1. **Opening Speeches (Remaining Students)**
2. **Students who didn't speak on Day 1 get their turn (90 seconds).**
3. **Question Hour**

Opposition & MPs ask previously submitted questions. Ministers respond. Rebuttals allowed if permitted by Speaker.

4. Parliamentary Debate (Agenda 1)

- *Ruling party presents its views*
- *Opposition counters*
- *Structured rebuttals permitted*

Zero Hour

Zero Hour

Moderator team presents 3–4 current issues.

Relevant cabinet ministers must respond briefly and responsibly.

Bill Presentation & Voting

1. Presentation of Bills

Designated presenters from each party introduce and explain their bill.

2. Debate on the Bill

- *Ruling party defends the bill*
- *Opposition critiques and suggests changes*
- *Structured rebuttals allowed*

3. Voting Process

Speaker calls for a vote by show of hands.

The bill is either passed or rejected based on majority.

Closing & Recognition

- Prime Minister's Summary
- Leader of Opposition's Summary
- Speaker's Final Words
- Awards & Valedictory Ceremony

Important Rules

1. **Reporting time:** 8am
2. **Session starts at:** 8:30 pm
3. **Session ends at:** 5 pm
4. School Coordinators & Parents will not be allowed inside the Parliament Hall during the session.
5. Full attendance on both days is mandatory. Any absence at any point during the program will lead to immediate disqualification.
6. No changes or substitutions will be allowed once a participant is registered.
7. No refund will be entertained under any circumstances.
8. Certificates will be awarded only to those who are present for the full duration of both days.
9. All participants are expected to maintain strict discipline and the decorum of the House at all times.
